

# Friday Church News Notes

### RICK WARREN RECOMMENDS WORDLESS CONTEMPLATION



Saddleback Church recommends a wide range of books on contemplative mysticism at its web site. *Spiritual Disciplines Handbook* by Adele Calhoun, for example, has been listed under the "Spiritual Growth" section for at least the past two years. Rick Warren, senior pastor at Saddleback, pretends that contemplative prayer is merely



getting alone in a quiet place to meditate on God's Word, but it goes far beyond that. Warren says that contemplative prayer is nothing like yoga, but as a former member of a Hindu meditation society, I can testify that practices such as centering prayer are definitely yoga-like. Adele Calhoun recommends Roman Catholic monastic practices which were, in turn, borrowed from paganism, as we have demonstrated in our book Contemplative Mysticism. Calhoun lists

Roman Catholics as "spiritual tutors," including M. Basil Pennington, Henri Nouwen, Peter Kreeft, William Meninger, Francis de Sales, Richard Rohr, William Johnson, Teresa of Avila, Thomas Keating, John of the Cross, Brother Lawrence, Tilden Edwards, Ignatius Loyola, St. Benedict, Thomas Merton, John Henry Newman, Julian of Norwich. Not only are these deeply misguided individuals laden down with Catholic heresies, but many were led by their mystical

practices to universalism, panentheism, and saddleback church (For example, Thomas Merton even rank idolatry. worshipped Buddhist idols.) Calhoun recommends following the Roman Catholic church calendar, seeking spiritual direction from Catholic orders, and visiting Catholic retreat centers. She describes a pilgrimage she took with 30 women in her "covenant group" to visit the sites of Catholic mystics and to study their practices. She recommends a whole slew of unscriptural contemplative practices, including the Jesus prayer (vain repetition), palms up palms down (psychological visualization), lectio divina, imagination prayer, centering prayer, breath prayer, practicing the presence, silence, and spiritual direction. She recommends the use of single words as a mantra to drive away conscious thoughts. "Choose a simple word ... Let this word guard your attention. ... When your thoughts wander let them drop to the bottom of your mind. Don't go after them. ... Imagine your distracting thoughts are part of the debris floating in the current of a river. Don't try to capture these thoughts; release them and let the river of God's life carry them away." In describing her mysticism she quotes Richard Rohr, "Prayer is not primarily saying words or thinking thoughts. It is, rather, a stance. It's a way of living in the Presence." This is not biblical contemplation; it is blind mysticism. Even when it comes to devotional reading of the Bible, Calhoun discourages "mentally critiquing or exegeting the text." Rather, the Bible is to be used as a launching pad for mysticism as the practitioner refuses to "analyze" it but merely "listens and waits." It is impossible to exaggerate the danger inherent in contemplative mysticism, and it is impossible to warn too loudly and plainly of the spiritual blindness of those "evangelical" leaders who are promoting it.

### **ISLAMIC NO-GO ZONES**

- The following is excerpted from "The Rise of Islamic No-Go Zones," FrontPageMag.com, Aug. 31, 2011: "Three and a half years ago, one of the Church of England's most senior bishops, Pakistani-born Michael Nazir-Ali, warned that Islamic extremists had created "nogo"areas across Britain too dangerous for non-Muslims to enter. His politically incorrect concern sparked a firestorm of denial and criticism. The Muslim Council of Britain, for example, dismissed it as the Bishop's 'frantic scaremongering' and 'intolerance,' and scoffed, 'We wouldn't allow no-go areas to happen. I smell extreme intolerance when people criticise multiculturalism without proper evidence of what has gone wrong.' Well, the evidence of how multiculturalism 'has gone wrong' is in. This week Soeren Kern at the Hudson Institute

documented the proliferation of such no-go zones throughout Europe -- autonomous Islamic 'microstates' under Sharia rule (having rejected their host countries' legal systems), where non-Muslims must either conform to the cultural, legal, and religious norms of fundamentalist Islam or expect to be greeted with violence. As Daniel Pipes puts it, 'a more precise name for these zones would be Dar al-Islam' -- the House of Islam, or the place where Islam rules. England, Sweden, Germany, France, Italy, the Netherlands -- in every European country with a large Muslim immigrant population, the story is the same: Islamic supremacists refuse to assimilate into the Western melting pot; instead they carve out a foothold in a neighborhood, and then, through intimidation or outright violence, push out the infidels whose failed secular values are no longer acceptable. Even public services such as police, firefighters and ambulances are often driven out of such neighborhoods with stones, bottles or bullets. Lacking the political and cultural will to assert control in areas that in some cases have become urban war zones, the authorities have simply retreated and abandoned them. ... In BRITAIN, WHERE THERE ARE ALREADY AS MANY AS EIGHTY-FIVE SHARIA COURTS IN OPERATION, an Islamist group called Muslims Against the Crusades has launched an ambitious campaign to turn twelve British cities into independent Islamic states,

including Birmingham, Leeds, Liverpool, Manchester, and what the group calls 'Londonistan.' In the Tower Hamlets in East London - or as the Muslims there refer to it, 'the Islamic Republic of Tower Hamlets' ... the neighborhood has been littered with leaflets announcing, 'You are entering a Sharia controlled zone. Islamic rules enforced.' ... In France, there are an astonishing 751 socalled Sensitive Urban Zones (ZUS). ... thousands of Muslims make their presence felt by blocking streets and sidewalks for Friday prayers. Some mosques have begun broadcasting sermons and chants of 'Allahu Akbar' via loudspeakers into the streets. Local authorities sit on their hands rather than confront this 'occupation without tanks or soldiers,' because they are afraid of the situation escalating into violence in the streets. The Dutch government has released a list of forty 'no-go' zones. In Brussels, Belgium, which is twenty percent Muslim, police have to patrol with two police cars, to watch each other's back. ... In Sweden, which an imam there has labeled 'the best Islamic state,' whole patches of the city of Malmö -which is more than twenty-five percent Muslim -- are nogo zones. There and in Gothenburg, Muslim teenagers have been burning cars, attacking emergency services, throwing stones at patrolling officers and temporarily blinding them with green lasers."


### THEY PAID THEIR DEBTS

I don't know the Baileys who are the subject of the following report, but I like how they took responsibility for their actions and paid off their debts. I have known members of Bible-believing churches who have filed for bankruptcy and walked away from debts. That is legal but it isn't righteous. There are times when you might not be able to pay a particular debt exactly on time and you have to stretch out payments and there is nothing wrong with trying to renegotiate the terms of a loan in extenuating circumstances, but pay the debt you must because you gave your word of honor when you borrowed it and a Christian must be a person of his or her word. "Wherefore putting away lying, speak every man truth with his neighbour: for we are members one of another" (Eph. 4:25). The following is excerpted from "Michigan Couple Honored for Paying Off \$92,000 Credit Card Debt," Yahoo Finance, Sept. 22, 2011: "The U.S. government can learn a lot about shedding debt from Jerry and Sue Bailey. The Jackson, Mich., couple paid off \$92,000 in credit card debt in 5-1/2 years. The couple's massive debt reduction earned them the Clients of the Year award from the National Foundation for Credit Counseling ... How did the Baileys end up in such a predicament? From 1992 to 2005, they ran up bills on 17 different credit cards. During that time, they paid for two weddings for their daughters (at a cost of \$5,000 each), replaced the transmission in their car when it blew out, made numerous repairs on their home and replaced the roof when it started to leak. Everything went on a credit card. ... Jerry [a pastor] handled the family finances but didn't let his wife, a nurse, know how much debt they were amassing. 'My first clue was when the people started calling our house,' Sue Bailey says, describing calls from debt collectors about unpaid bills. ... The couple sought help in May 2005 from their local

credit union. A representative suggested they file for bankruptcy, but the couple dismissed that option. 'We just don't believe in that,' Sue Bailey says. 'We believe in paying what we owe.' The credit union then suggested they contact GreenPath Debt Solutions, a nonprofit credit counseling agency ... GreenPath and other nonprofit credit counseling agencies enroll financially troubled consumers in debt management plans to pay off outstanding debt. ... The agencies have a long track record of negotiating with creditors to reduce interest rates and make affordable monthly payments. The Baileys' road to debt freedom wasn't easy. ... Through budgeting, sacrificing and taking on extra work to earn more income, the Baileys paid off their debt in October 2010. ... Sue Bailey's advice to other couples sharing finances: 'Talk to each other; don't play the blame game. I didn't blame him. We did it together."

### **UNBELIEF AT NAZARENE COLLEGES**

The following is from Ken Ham's "Around the World" blog [Answers in Genesis], August 23, 2011: "Over the past couple of years, I have brought to people's attention the rampant compromise with evolution and billions of years that many professors at Nazarene colleges hold to--and teach their students. One of those compromised professors is Dr. Karl

Giberson. Recently, Answers in Genesis produced the book *Already Compromised*. Thankfully, God had provided the necessary material I needed and I actually owned the book from which he misquoted Ryrie and could see for myself what Ryrie actually stated. I believe that he was among several at ENC who heavily influenced a close relative who is now straying from her faith.""

That is exactly the attitude that many fundamental Baptist preachers have toward my preaching ministry. They refuse to use my materials even though they would be helpful to their people. A fundamental Baptist pastor wrote recently and said that God doesn't raise up "warning" ministries and that the only warning that churches need is that of their own pastors.


My answer is that 2 Timothy 4:2; Titus 2:15; 1 Peter 4:1; and Jude 3, to mention only a few of the commands to reprove error, are not limited to a pastor preaching in his own church.

I think I recall that there was a pastor in the early churches that refused to allow biblically-sound men of God to minister to his people, and his name was

Diotrephes. He was the first strutting poobah on record within the New Testament churches. "I wrote unto the church: but Diotrephes, who loveth to have the preeminence among them, receiveth us not. Wherefore, if I come, I will remember his deeds which he doeth, prating against us with malicious words: and not content therewith, neither doth he himself receive the brethren, and forbiddeth them that would, and casteth them out of the church" (3 John 1:9-10).


