Then they crossed another body of water - the River Jordan. Though relatively small, it was vet a significant crossing because the waters of the Jordan, overflowing at that time of the year, opened also to allow the children of Israel to cross over into the Promised Land. There, they set their feet on Gilgal, the first place in the Promised Land. The first and

great General Joshua did was to ask for 12 stones to be pitched in Gilgal. A site of any significant event in the life of the Israelites was often indicated by a monument to remember the great work that God had done for them.

The Lord has done great works for us, has He not? The twelve stones served to remind the Israelites of the goodness of God and His Promises. What work has God done that we should remember?

We need to remember our salvation. This was the place where Christ won the victory for us. This was where our sins and shame was removed and dealt with. This was where Satan had to flee, and where our soul was set free from sin and death. This was where our relationship with Christ is eternally secured and our Spirit forever joined to the Heavenly family. What a day of joy for us and for the angels of Heaven. Scripture declares there is joy over one sinner that repenteth! We need to remember our salvation as it encourages us in our despair, strengthens us in our trials, cheers us in our dark moments and lifts us up when we fall. Remembering our salvation helps us to know that we are mere pilgrims in this world and we are just passing through. The things we have here and the possessions we gather here are merely temporary. We have a far more glorious inheritance awaiting us.

We need to remember our Saviour. The Canaanites were an idolatrous people but when they heard that the people of the God Who opened the Red Sea were coming, they trembled. They could not have crossed the Red Sea and then the River Jordan without the aid of GOD - the Lord

Jesus, our Saviour. Our Saviour is such a wondrous gift to this world and to us. He came to show us how to live, how to love and how to lead a life that is glorifying to God. His life inspires us, His love encourages us and how he led His life challenges us to be more and more like Him. As the Israelites stood and pitched the stones at Gilgal, they were not merely remembering the opening of Jordan but "That all the people of the earth might know the hand of the LORD, that it is mighty: that ye might fear the LORD your God for ever." (Joshua 4:24)

We need to remember our sanctification. Twelve stones represented all of Israel - the twelve tribes. Similarly, it represents our completeness in Christ. As we progress into the Promised Land, we are to allow God to sanctify us and change us into his likeness. The children of Israel would face giants and enemies in the Land. We, too, will face giants and enemies in our Christian life. Yet, we are equipped with the Holy Spirit and His Word to lead and guide us, to strengthen us in the way and to help us overcome our sins, ourselves and Satan.

Are we, as we stand at the threshold of Jordan and look at our "Promised Land," be unable to go across with the authorities and the giants in the land or with our sins and unbelief? Will our unwillingness to go across in the name of the Lord stop us? With faith in His will and obedience to His word; with love for each other and strength for the word; with concern for our young ones and consideration for the weaker Christians, will we remember and go forward as the children of Israel did? Let us remember our God and love our brethren so that we truly roll off the reproach of Egypt and move on



secular music at home. There is no dress code and it seems the clothes are getting worse and worse. I am afraid if I let my children participate in the youth program that they will be influenced in a negative way. I feel like out of the entire church, there are only a very few people who understand or even care about the biblical position I am taking. I'm afraid that if the preacher pushes too hard, they will boot him out." REPLY FROM BROTHER **CLOUD**: Since I do largely agree with the statement that "everything rises and falls on leadership," much of the problem in the situation you have described must fall at the pastor's feet. Preaching right and strong is a good and necessary thing, but it isn't enough. The Word of truth and holiness must be exemplified in the lives of the pastors and their families and in the lives of the teachers and workers. It must be modeled by high standards for officers and workers, supported by direct confrontation of sin, and enforced by discipline. It's not enough to preach God's Word from the pulpit; church members must be dealt with one-on-one. The preacher is to warn and teach EVERY MAN (Colossians 1:28). A pastor can't force every church member to be faithful and to dress right, etc., but he can require this of those who represent the church in a leadership or ministry capacity. If the pastor preaches against immodest dress and contemporary, worldly music and exhorts the people to faithfulness, but

ANOTHER ISRAELI MINISTER CALLS FOR BUILDING THE THIRD TEMPLE

Uri Ariel has become the second Israeli government minister in a year to call for building the Third Temple. Speaking at an archaeological conference near ancient Shilo, where the Tabernacle was located in the day of Samuel, Ariel said, "We've built many little, little temples [referring to synagogues], but we need to build a real Temple on the Temple Mount" ("Minister Calls for Third Temple," The Times of Israel, July 5, 2013). Ariel, Israel's Housing and Construction Minister, is a member of the Jewish Home party. In 2012 Zevulun Orlev, another Jewish Home MK, called for rebuilding the Jewish Temple, though he acknowledged that removing the Dome of the Rock and al-Aqsa Mosque would mean that the "billion-strong Muslim world would surely launch a world war." It will probably be up to the antichrist, who will come on the scene as a man of peace and a great world problem solver, to make the building of the Third Temple possible. When he shows his true colors, he will sit in that temple and require the world to worship him. "Let no man deceive you by any means: for that day shall not come, except there come a falling away first, and that man of sin be revealed, the son of perdition; Who opposeth and exalteth himself above all that is called God, or that is worshipped; so that he as God sitteth in the temple of God, shewing himself that he is God" (2 Thessalonians 2:3-4).

allows his own wife and children or his teachers and deacons to dress immodestly and to listen to worldly music and to be unfaithful, his preaching will be sounding brass and tinkling cymbals. can bless and empower the 20 far more than the 200. What Gideon needed was an army of true soldiers more than a multitude of nominal ones. As for church finances, God will always take care of those who honor Him and His Word (Matthew 6:33). God isn't dependent on any big tither who stands in the way of His holy business.

FAITHFULNESS TO THE HOUSE OF GOD

The following is adapted from "Faithfulness in God's House" by Pastor Terry Coomer, www.fortheloveofthefamily.com -- "Obviously, there are emergencies where a person must be out of church, but I have found that people who are loose with their attendance on the Lord's Day always have spiritual issues and generally their family and children suffer. (They are emotionled rather than Bible-led.) Years ago, I had a man in our church who worked for an automaker that paid double time for working on the Lord's Day. He did this many times for the money. He had two children who grew up to be disasters and he spent that money many times over getting them out of the jams they were in. At the end of his life, suffering from a debilitating disease, he was wheelchair bound. He told me, 'Pastor I wish I had never done that by working on Sunday; I lost my children and look at their lives!' Folks, the last six months of his life he sat in a wheelchair looking out a window crying over his family. All his children were interested in was how much money they would get when he

died! He had raised selfish children. In the past I was the publisher of a newspaper, a top executive in our company, and had several people working for me. I made sure our employees understood that we do not work on Sunday. A pastor friend used to say, 'There are other people who can do that job and God can provide a job for you so that you do not have to be out of God's house.' I agree. When I got saved I played professional baseball in the San Francisco Giants organization. I was a pitcher, but I knew I could not continue because they play baseball on Sunday and the Bible commands me to be in God's house. I know that many people in a sports-oriented world don't want their children to miss out on activities of this nature. Being unfaithful to God's house to play sports shows lack of spiritual understanding and will lead to a stolen heart. ... When sports become a god, spiritual disaster takes place. ...

Just because others make poor decisions does not mean that I should. I should

want my children to grow up and walk with God, but this will not happen if willful sin is in my life. God blesses faithfulness; He does not bless slothfulness. 'Moreover it is required in stewards, that a man

be found faithful' (1 Cor. 4:2)."

KNOWLEDGE SHALL INCREASE

About 2,500 years ago, during the Persian Empire, an angel told the prophet Daniel, "But thou, O Daniel, shut up the words, and seal

the book, even to the time of the end: many shall run to and fro, and knowledge shall be increased" (Daniel 12:4). We are seeing a dramatic fulfillment of this in our day. Recent inventions include the following:

Intravenous oxygen injection. Scientists at Boston Children's Hospital have invented an injection filled

with gas-filled microparticles that delivers oxygen directly into the bloodstream for patients who cannot

breathe, reducing the incidence of organ injury and cardiac arrest. Animals have been kept alive without breathing for 15 minutes (Medical News Today, July 1, 2012).

Advanced biological computer. Is raeli scientists have developed an advanced molecular computer built entirely of biomolecules, such as

DNA and enzymes, that can manipulate genetic codes ("Technion Scientists Develop," *Israel National News*, May 23, 2013). The biological computer can perform long division of binary numbers and can do iterative computation, which means it uses output as a new input for subsequent computations.



FDA-approved bionic eye. The FDA has approved a first generation bionic eye system that will regain some degree of sight to some blind people ("Can a Bionic Eye See,"

Popular Science, May 20, 2013). The system isn't like normal vision, but it has made it possible for test patients to see black and white and discern shades of gray.




3D object generated using brain waves. A Chilean tech company claims to have created the first physical object using a brain computer-interfaced with a 3D printer ("Mind Control," *Fox*

News, May 23, 2013). The object resembles the arm of a toy robot.



Ingestible computer pills are set to go mainstream in 2014. "The smart pills are actually tiny robots that travel through your digestive system

and monitor how everything works, from your vitals to blood flow to temperature in real time. They wirelessly transmit results to a cell phone app, body patch or website. Proteus Digital Health is one startup that's working on an ingestible computer ... Its pills use stomach acid for power instead of batteries" ("We Will Soon Be Swallowing Computers," *Business Insider*, June 24, 2013).



Rocket parts are being created with 3D printing technology. NASA has 3D-printed an injector to deliver liquid oxygen and hydrogen gas to a rocket engine's

combustion chamber ("NASA tests 3D-printed rocket engine fuel injector," *BBC Technology News*, July 15, 2013). The goal is to create a technology that astronauts could use in space to build replacement parts.

THE SOLUTION TO DEPRESSION

The following is excerpted from John Phillips' commentary on Psalm 119: "My soul cleaveth unto the dust: quicken thou me according to thy word" (Psa. 119:25). "There can be little doubt that the psalmist was in the grip of deep depression. He was flat on his face in the dust. He had come to the end of himself and his own resources. At this point our society would advise us to see a psychiatrist, seek professional help. ... The psalmist makes a different suggestion. He says to the Lord, 'Quicken Thou me.' He was going to air his problems all right, but he was going to take them to the Lord. He was going to seek a counselor--the counsel of the Word of God. There are very few problems in this life that cannot be solved by a thorough-going, honest exposure of one's life to

the Scriptures. To do that is the greatest therapy in the world. The psalmist asked God to 'quicken him,' that is, to put new life into him. What he needed was a stiff dose of Scripture, taken with a mixture of faith, every day. Try it. Read your Bible consistently. Say with Samuel, 'Speak, Lord, Thy servant heareth.' The Bible is a book of people and principles. Sooner or later, God will confront us in the pages of His Book with the basic cause of our problem and with His inspired, infallible solution to that problem. The psalmist had discovered the best way of all to handle depression. But we must be prepared. The Bible will not hedge or redefine sin. It will put its finger unerringly on the sin question, frequently at the root of other problems of life."

PLANTS FOCUS LIGHT



The following is from Creation Moments, May 21, 2013: "In many ways, a plant is like a machine that changes the energy of sunlight into food energy that is needed by the rest of the living world. The energy which runs the plant is light. Now, if you were going to design a better, more efficient plant, how might you do it? Obviously, one way to improve a plant would be to create one that can do its job with less light. But remember, the plant cannot store more energy than it receives. And if the plant was too sensitive to light, a strong dose of sunlight could kill it. The obvious solution is to outfit the plant with tiny lenses which focus even dim light into the chemical centers where photosynthesis takes place. Due to man's ignorance, modern science has often regarded plants as if they were simple, unsophisticated forms of life. Now scientists have discovered that many plants do indeed have special cells which focus and concentrate the available light into the very centers where it is needed. One plant's shaded leaves were found to intensify available light by 26 times. And if the light gets so strong that it could damage the leaves, the light is focused onto cells which can absorb the extra light. Plants are much more complex, higher-performance living things than we ever suspected. Plants incorporate designs based on a highly sophisticated knowledge of both chemistry and physics. What a wonderful witness they are to our Creator!"
